Understanding Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany

I will always remember being in worship in my home church, singing *Emmanuel, Emmanuel* and suddenly realizing why we hear and sing this word so much around Christmas time: it means "God with us." Christmas is about Jesus, fully human and fully divine, being born to be God with us. Up to the moment in my early 20s, I never got it!

This is just one example of why I have something of a passion for sharing the meaning of why we do what we do. It means so much more this way.

The earliest evidence of **Advent** we have dates to a council in Spain in the year 380. It was decreed that "from December 17 until the day of **Epiphany** which is January 6 no one is permitted to be absent from Church." (*Not a bad idea, says the pastor*) By the fifth century a 40 day season of preparation for **Epiphany** was being practiced in Gaul. This paralleled Lent and began about when Advent now begins. Notice the importance of Epiphany, January 6? This day was originally more important than December 25. The date of Christmas was likely set as a way to replace a pagan holiday celebrating the winter solstice.

Epiphany literally means "manifestation." It is the day the Church refers to the manifestation of God in Jesus Christ (Emmanuel, God with us). Epiphany originally celebrated the birth of Christ, the baptism of Jesus, and the first miracle- Jesus turning water to wine in Cana. The common theme here is Jesus manifesting God to human beings. It was later, in the fourth century, that the story of the wise men visiting Jesus became more of the focus of Epiphany.

Guess how many days there are between **Christmas and Epiphany**? If you guessed twelve, you get a gold star. The **12 days of Christmas** refer to the Christmas season. The song was actually written in England to pass along the faith in code, I think by Roman Catholics, when it was dangerous to be a Catholic, depending on the monarch in power.

Advent developed as a season needed to prepare for Christmas and Epiphany. Originally, Advent was a more penitential season, similar to Lent. In modern times, the focus has shifted away from penitence and toward focusing on God's promises. Advent literally means "coming" and so we focus on Jesus' coming return, and then Jesus' coming to us in the flesh (incarnate).

The use of 3 violet **candles** and one rose candle actually dates to an obsolete Roman Catholic practice (before Vatican II in the 1960s when lots of things changed for Roman Catholics) of viewing Advent as a season for penitence. The rose candle was lighted on the third Sunday of Advent as a visual sign of easing off of the other violet Sundays when penitence was the focus.

Why is violet purple the color for Advent? We use this for vestments (the stole I wear around my neck), advent candles, and paraments (the cloths on the pulpit and table) because purple is the color of royalty. We prepare to celebrate the birth of our King, and so we use purple. Historically, this was an expensive color to use to dye fabric, and so only the wealthy could afford it. (Purple is also the color of penitence in the church, thus Lent is also draped in purple. It may be my favorite liturgical color.)

Advent-Christmas-Epiphany themes include: from hope to joy, from darkness to light (as the days grow shorter, we light our candles in protest against the darkness and look forward to the birth of the True Light), from yearning for deliverance to the very manifestation of God's coming. We focus upon the promises of a world redeemed, society set right, God's final shalom- justice, peace, righteousness, and reconciliation. Advent is a time to give thanks for the gift of Christ to us in the past, and a time of anticipation of Christ's return.

I invite and challenge you to you open yourself to the season in meaningful ways. Don't allow the secular busyness of holiday parties and such consume you. Allow God's themes to resonate within your soul, join with the gathered community to worship every week of the Advent-Christmas-Epiphany season.

Dec. 1 Willet Concert...Outreach:

This year we are kicking off Advent with an exciting event: On December 1 we are having an outreach concert featuring the band "Willet", who are going to come play some of their songs as well as some Christmas songs! This concert will be a great time for fellowship as well as outreach, so please spread the word and invite as many people as you can. Admission will be \$3 per person, and food will be available for sale. The event is from 7-10 pm at Jacob's Well (the Bo Manor Auditorium).

Confirmation

We are also kicking off Confirmation this month. Confirmation classes will officially begin January 17, but we are going to have an interest meeting at 3:30 pm on Sunday, December 16. Students and parents are invited to stay for youth group; the lesson will be from "Claim the Name", the curriculum that confirmation class will use.

There are some changes to our confirmation program this year. Because we know that confirmation is an important time of spiritual growth and discernment, we are going to try a 2-year confirmation process. This winter, confirmands will have classes on Thursday nights from January 17-March 13 (right before Holy Week). Next fall and spring, they will meet with a mentor and have hands-on experience with the ministries and organization of the church. Those who choose to do so will be confirmed in the spring of 2009.

The idea for this change came about after observing that during our last confirmation class, it was very difficult to pack education, mentoring, and experiential learning into such a short period of time without wearing out families. By extending the length of the program, we can also slow the pace. It is also important that we allow time for discernment; while many youth begin thinking about faith around the age of 12, the critical time for developing commitment to church seems to be later for many. Confirmation is the church's way of making space for youth to wrestle with faith and develop a personal commitment to Christ, and in taking more time we can continue to honor that process.

"DID YOU HEAR ME?"

"Did you hear me?" How often, as a parent, do I remember that question. It seemed as my children grew, I used it more often. And more often than not, I thought whatever I was saying fell on deaf ears. Parenting styles differ, but most who look honestly, must admit speaking those words at least once or twice.

Since I was not "conventional", my children were not necessarily grounded in a church family. They were well acquainted with the Bible, and over the course of years had been introduced to several organized religions. I believed in God, was raised in the Catholic Church and never doubted a greater hand in my life. That was instilled in each of my children, though there were many times I wondered if they "heard me." And just as many times I wondered if HE was punishing me through their actions for my own failings as I grew up! I often thought GOD must be quite a prankster!

As I sit and have enjoyable and open conversations with my daughter, Jessica, who is now 32...I realize she did hear me. When she entered nursing school, I worried. She struggled as a student throughout high school and she waited until her early mid-20's to begin college. Jess has changed her major, but never the dedication to medicine. I prayed for her many nights, asking God to keep her close to his heart and enable her to succeed. I asked for HIS guidance as to the direction she would travel. And, I often told Jess she was in my prayers. With every solid grade, I silently thanked God, and reminded her to do the same. "Before every test, remember to say a prayer," was my on-going mantra.

Jess is in her final year of nursing. She will graduate in May, 2008. Jess has been an honors student, maintaining a full course load and a full time job. While she has scaled back on work this last quarter, she still pushes herself. She is struggling some now with her tests, and I realize I have forgotten to remind her to pray before each one and after. Such a small thing...a short prayer...but such a powerful impact! I have heard her say more than once, that she has thanked GOD after a test. But now is the most difficult time, and Jess has had to face some difficult personal issues in this past year...adding to the overall stress.

Still, I know she heard me. She speaks more openly about her belief in God and her faith that he is with her. She is in a stage of life where organized religion is not a part of the picture. But GOD, is ingrained in her and Jess is becoming more comfortable and open to listening to others' views and acknowledging her own acceptance, belief and faith in this great being who directs and guides our footsteps. And I am blessed to know, all did not fall on deaf ears neither my daughter's nor GOD's.

Shepherd's Pie

Our Jen Dolde has had many requests for her recipe for "Shepherd's Pie". She has made it both years for the rotating shelter where it was a great hit. Whenever Jen makes it, she is asked for the recipe because everyone enjoys it so much. She is generously sharing the recipe below:

Shepherd's Pie (double recipe for a hotel pan)

- 1 1/2 - 2 lb. ground beef
- 1 cup chopped onion
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- Pinch each of dried thyme and savory
- Salt and pepper
- 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 2 cups beef stock

- 1 tsp. Worcestershire sauce
- 2 medium carrots, diced small
- 4 large potatoes
- 3/4 cup milk
(or instant mashed potatoes, thinned to spreading consistency)
- 1 egg, lightly beaten

In large skillet, cook ground beef lightly, stirring with fork to break it up. Drain any excess fat. Add onion and garlic; cook until softened. Stir in thyme, savory and a little salt and pepper. Stir in flour. Add stock, Worcestershire sauce and carrots. Simmer partially covered, about 20 minutes, stirring often, until fairly thick and carrots are tender. Add salt and pepper to taste, if needed. Spread mixture in 13x9x2-inch baking dish. Let cool slightly.

Meanwhile, boil potatoes in salted water until tender; drain and mash. Beat in milk. Reserve half of egg for brushing on top; beat rest of egg into potatoes. Spread potato mixture carefully over meat mixture (start from edges). Brush with remaining egg. Bake in 400 F oven for about 15 minutes or until bubbling hot and topping is golden. Makes about 6 servings.

TOWN POINT COUNCIL MINUTES November 15, 2007

November 15, 2007 Town Point Admin Council

Attendees: Ursula Livesay, Pastor Amy, John Ryan, Mikki Senn, Doug Senn, Carol Wieser, Ida Pearce, Jen Dolde, Pam Dolde

The meeting was called to order and opening prayers were held.

Ursula made a motion and Mikki seconded the amending of the previous minutes regarding the budget. Corrected minutes will state....

The 2007 Town Point budget allocated \$6000 for missions. At this time, Town Point will earmark some money for contribution toward the Homeless Shelter expenses and give \$1200 to CCEA (additional funds – if available- can be sent later). Meeting Ground would receive \$500 and Kirk and Sarah Irwin at Campus Crusade for Christ \$500 – a total of \$3000. The Council voted to reimburse Mary Meadows \$150 for the office furniture which she was able to acquire for us at a very good price.

Motion was made by Ida to accept the minutes and 2nd by Carol.

Trustees: Discussion was held regarding the replacement of the sign on TP grounds. The estimated cost of this sign is approx \$350-\$500 and there is enough money in the budget. Ida made a motion that we authorize the trustees to go up to \$650 to replace the sign, seconded by Doug.

John Ryan repaired the sign at TP Road – thank you John!!!

SPRC: Sandy will be retiring in June (approx) and we will again need to search for a replacement for her.

Budget: Ursula reported....

The CD held at PNC comes due at the end of December and a decision must be made as to what we will do with these funds. Current rates at PNC are not very good so Ursula suggested that all the funds currently held at PNC be closed out and the monies placed in Vanguard (Money Market) at 5+%. Mikki questioned how would we pay bills without a checking account? Jen questioned whether we would change to one checking account when the charge merges? Both of these questions need further consideration.

It was decided that we will take the PNC savings to minimum balance and put the difference in the Vanguard. Memorial funds and the CD will also be moved to Vanguard. Ursula made a motion to approve the budget and Ida seconded.

Leadership Team: Pam and Amy will both attempt to reach Sandy Butkus to ask if she will consider serving on the Pre-school Board.

Mikki said she is willing to serve on the Human Relations (previously SPRC) but is unable to serve as Chair due to numerous other commitments. Thoughtful prayer will need to be given as to who will be able/willing to chair and clarification will be needed for a few spots on the list.

Mikki suggested that we find a backup for Bud's duties while he is in treatment.

Amy suggested that we put a Class year for all categories. Mikki made a motion that we thank the committee that created the leadership team positions and to accept the list as it is with the understanding that a few changes may be made. Second was made by Carol.

It was suggested that the TP Memorial Servant will be a shared position with MaryAnna Taylor and Cathy Ebright. This will create an additional "bracket" under section III (Memorial Servant). Part "3" will include MaryAnna and Cathy and Part "4" will include two members from Trinity to serve as Memorial Servants.

New Business:

Will there be a Christmas dinner this year? If so, when?

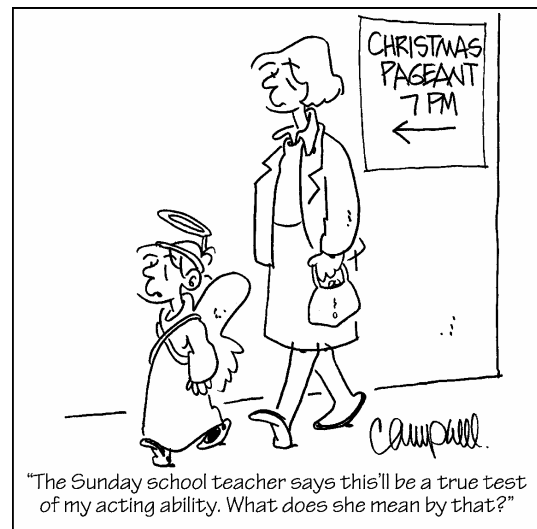
A suggestion was made to make the tree lighting and covered dish dinner at TR on December 2 at 5pm a combined celebration for the three congregations. Marian Harvey has been helpful with this in the past.

Christmas Eve worship times: TR 5pm, TP 7pm, TR 11pm quiet communion.

Christmas play at TR on Dec 16, possibly.

Special music/entertainment will be available throughout Advent – including dancing, piano, flutes, horns and of course the bells- Great Job and thanks to all those who have committed to make our Advent season extra special.

Preschool has shared that the classroom supplies are being used by others and the classroom setup is not being found in the same condition it was left when the teachers leave at the end of the week. Director Maura reinforced that the preschool understands it shares its space with other parties, and is happy to do so; however, there has been a recent surge in missing items that are difficult to replace and that disrupts the preschool attendees' daily routine and learning. We will need to try and discover what can be done to help the preschool room remain in the same condition as it was left.
