Gayle Mayo is serving as interim director during the summer and early fall months while a new director is found. Gayle will return as the lead staff person for the Emergency Rotating Shelter in November.

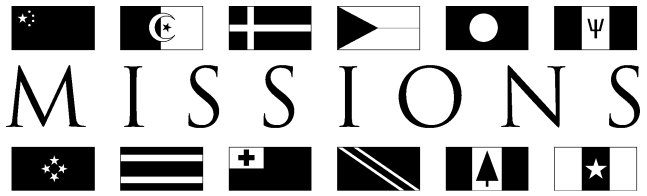
The initial plan is to have the Mary Randall Center open Monday, Wednesday, and Friday mornings. It is located at 401 North Street in Elkton. Target open date is June 12. Showers, breakfast, and laundry facilities will be the initial offerings. The servant needs are:

- *Servants on June 8 and 10 to do intake in preparation for the June 12 opening. A staff person will be on site to lead.
- *Help to inventory and organize supplies
- *Serve on Mon., Wed., or Fri. to distribute towels, soap, laundry detergent as well as keep the coffee flowing.
- *Serve by spending time in the coffee and breakfast room with the folks being served, showing them love by listening and talking together.
- *Grass cutting is also a need. Mower and trimmer supplied at site.

The Emergency Rotating Shelter (ERS) is being planned again to begin in the fall. We will be hosting the first week of November this year to begin the shelter season, as well as a week in March.

As we work through the Appreciative Inquiry process of conversations, we will compile the stories and look for themes to help achieve the goals. Then we will review the results with the congregation and reach consensus about where we are being led by the Spirit from here.

As it says in Philippians, *finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things.* (Phil. 4:8), we look forward to these conversations about our experiences that are true, just, pure, pleasing, commendable, excellent and worthy of praise, and discerning how the Spirit is leading us next.

Financial Update

I find being a part of a church family to be a tremendous blessing. This is the community that I love and that loves me in return day in and day out. You are the people who show me what Jesus looks like, and it is a privilege to serve the Lord together.

It is in this community, in our shared love of God, that we are opened to transformation...to becoming the persons God intends for us to be. It is in ministry together that we follow Christ's call to make disciples for the transformation of the world.

As you well know, 2008 and 2009 have been challenging times financially for many families in our community. God has provided for our needs thus far, and we trust that God will continue to do so.

Yet we are experiencing financial strain, and continue to have members go through job loss and transition. **I am asking you to prayerfully consider increasing your financial support of God's ministry in this place.**

This will help ensure that we will continue to live out our mission, *to make disciples by inviting, developing, and sending people in the name of Jesus Christ.* God calls us to this mission, no matter what the economy is like. In truth, the ministry of God's church is in even greater demand. We are making a difference in our community and in our world, and you are an important part of what God is doing.

We have dealt with last year's deficit and have been very frugal in our spending without curtailing our missions. If you would like a detailed copy of the budget and the actual that were pre-

sented at the April 29 congregational meeting, copies are available at each worship center.

This year, we are also incurring expenses that we had no knowledge of when we set the budget, most notably that we will be paying for the use of Bo Manor at \$120/ week beginning in June.

In addition, we are taking a tremendous step in faith to launch Camp Joy. Tuitions are set to cover the costs for staff and materials. Utility expenses will come out of our church budget.

We ask you to examine your heart and your check book and look for ways to increase your financial support to meet these needs in ministry.

If you are not yet using direct debit, I also ask you to consider using this service, as it helps with our cash flow so we know more definitely what is arriving when.

We trust that God will provide. Is God calling you to be a part of the way that God will provide for ministry this year?
